WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE BARBER PROGRAM?

The Cosmetology Boards of Georgia require 1500 clock hours for graduation and testing in Barbering.

The first 280 hours are dedicated to core fundamentals and consist of classroom lectures, demonstrations, practice on mannequins and evaluations. Upon completing this section, you will be transferred to the advanced portion of training, in which you will be allowed to practice on guests on the barbering floor.

In addition to technical instruction, you will also learn vital business skills that will help you in your career, including customer service, hygiene, retail skills, record keeping and business ethics.

WILL I EARN A LICENSE?

Upon completing the Barber program at HSI, you will receive a diploma and be prepared to pass the State exam. Once you have passed this exam, you will become a licensed barber.

WHAT KINDS OF COURSES WILL I TAKE?

The curriculum at HSI covers a wide range of barbering techniques to prepare you for career success. Some of the things you'll study are:

Hair Cutting -

From basic skills like shaping and trimming, to more advanced techniques like razor cutting and freehand, you'll get hands-on experience in the day-to-day work of a barber while learning to execute the latest styles.

Facial Hair Maintenance -

Learn to line up beards, trim goatees and shave clients as you study a range of techniques applied to facial hair.

Hair Coloring –

Covering the chemistry of hair coloring, you'll learn various formulations and application techniques to help your clients achieve the perfect shade.

Shop Management -

Your education will also include basic management skills to help you effectively run your business. You'll learn best-practices for client relations, inventory, bookkeeping and sanitation compliance
